at least ten days before the first day of said first summer sitting, and one week before the first day of each September and October sitting, by publication in six daily newspapers published in Baltimore city having the largest circulation in said city, one of which shall be in the German language, and one of which newspapers shall be of opposite political

opinions to those held by the registers.

SEC. 13. And be it enacted, That the several officers of registration appointed in each county shall give in each year a collective notice signed by them, of their said respective sittings to be held in said year under the provisions of this act, and of the places of sitting in each election district, and of the times at which each of said respective sittings shall take place; said notice shall be given by said officers of registration at least ten days before the first day of their first summer sitting, and one week before the first day of their respective September and October sittings, by publication in two newspapers published in said county of opposite political opinions, having the largest respective circulation in said county, and by handbills set up in such public places in each election district or in the election precincts of each election district, if each election district be so divided, as each of said officers of registration shall select, in their respective districts; but if there should be no papers of opposite political opinions in any of the counties of this State as above specified, then in two newspapers which may be published in different sections or parts of said county, if there be such.

SEC. 14. And be it enacted, That if for any necessary cause the place or places of meeting in any election district in any county of this State, or in any group of election precincts in the city of Baltimore, or (in and after the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four) in any ward in said city, shall be changed after advertisement thereof, immediate notice shall be given thereof by new advertisement, if the change be made in the city of Baltimore, in all the daily newspapers of said city, and by printed handbills set up in public places in said respective election precincts or wards in which such place or places of meeting shall have been changed; and if such change be made in any county, by advertise-
