

informer, or imprisonment in jail for a period of not less than six months nor more than one year.

60. Any owner, tenant or occupant of any building, house, vessel or place who shall knowingly permit any gaming table to be kept in such building, house, vessel or place, or in any part of any building, house, vessel or place, owned or occupied by him, or of which he is tenant, shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, one-half to go to the informer, or imprisonment in jail for a period of not less than six months nor more than one year, or both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Not to permit gaming.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Chapter 272.

AN ACT to repeal section three of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, chapter two hundred and twenty-three, entitled "An act to regulate fishing with Seines or Nets in that part of the waters of Synepuxent bay and its tributaries, which extends north of an east and west line passing through the southern extremity of South Point, in Worcester County," and to amend and re-enact the same as amended.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section three of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, chapter two hundred and twenty-three, entitled "An act to regulate fishing with Seines or Nets in that part of the waters of Synepuxent bay and its tributaries, which extends north of an east and west line, passing through the southern extremity of South Point, in Worcester county," be and the same is hereby repealed, amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
