

**Chapter 308.**

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact in a new and amended form sections seventy-nine, eighty, eighty-one, eighty-two, eighty-three and eighty-four of article thirty-five of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections," sub-title "Representatives in Congress," as the same were repealed and re-enacted by the act of January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter four hundred and eighteen.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That sections seventy-nine, eighty, eighty-one, eighty-two, eighty-three and eighty-four of article thirty-five of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Elections," sub title "Representatives in Congress," as the same were repealed and re-enacted by the acts of January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter four hundred and eighteen, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repealed and re-enacted.

79. This State shall be divided into six districts for the choosing of six representatives in the Congress of the United States, which shall be numbered respectively from one to six.

Divided into six districts.

80. The first congressional district shall be composed of Worcester county, Somerset county, Wicomico county, Dorchester county, Talbot county, Queen Anne's county, Caroline county and Kent county, and shall be entitled to choose one representative in the House of Representatives.

First congressional district.

81. The second congressional district shall be composed of Cecil county, Harford county, Carroll county and the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth election districts of Baltimore county, and shall be entitled to choose one representative in the House of Representatives.

Second congressional district.

82. The third congressional district shall be composed of the election precincts of the city of Baltimore from number one to number seventy-six, both numbers inclusive, and numbers seventy-eight, seventy-nine, eighty-four, eighty-five and one hun-

Third congressional district.
