

When payable. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That said bonds shall be issued payable fifteen years from the date thereof, and redeemable at any time after the expiration of five years from the date thereof, at the pleasure of the county commissioners.

Levy upon assessable property. SEC. 6. *And be it further enacted,* That the said county commissioners shall, in each and every year, levy upon the assessable property in Dorchester county, such sum of money as may be necessary to pay the interest on the outstanding bonds by them issued under the provisions of this act as the same shall fall due, and in addition to the annual interest, after five years from the date of issuing said bonds, they shall levy in each and every year such further and additional sums as may be required to gradually retire and redeem such bonds until they shall all have been redeemed; and, provided further, that after the lapse of the said five years, they shall not levy in each and every year less than one-tenth of the original principal sum of said bonds for their redemption.

How kept and designated. SEC. 7. *And be it further enacted,* That the money raised by the issue and sale of bonds under the provisions of this act shall be kept and designated as the "jail fund," and shall be applied exclusively to the cost of the erection of the said new jail and the purchase of the new grounds therefor; and the said tax authorized by this act shall be collected as all other taxes are collected in said county.

Disagreement—how settled. SEC. 8. *And be it further enacted,* That should the said county commissioners determine to erect said building at any other or different place than upon the lot now occupied by the present jail of said county, and the said county commissioners and the owner or owners of said ground or grounds desired for the erection of such buildings shall not be able to agree upon the price of such real estate, or in case the owner or owners of the same, or any of them, be *feme covert*, infant or *non-compos mentis*, the president of said board of county commissioners shall make application to the clerk of the Circuit Court for Dorchester county, who shall thereupon issue a writ *ad quod damnum*, under his hand and seal of office, directed to the sheriff of Dorchester county, requiring him to summon twenty persons, qualified to act as jurors, not interested in the property to be
