Deeds to be delivered.

Sec. 5. *And be it further enacted*, That as soon as the Northern Central Railway Company shall have delivered to the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore the deeds for the lot of ground now used as its Bolton Depot, and described in the fourth section of this act, the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore may proceed under its ordinances to open through said property such street or streets as it may think desirable, and from thenceforth the provisions of the third section of the act of Assembly of Maryland, of eight hundred and forty-nine, chapter five hundred and thirty-two, so far as the same closes or covenants to close any streets through said property, shall be and are hereby declared to be repealed; and the faith of the State of Maryland is hereby pledged to and the said State does hereby contract with the said Northern Central Railway Company, that upon making of the deed by it to the said Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, as provided for in the fourth section of this act, no streets shall ever be opened through the ground described in the first section of this act; and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, upon the receipt of the said deed from the Northern Central Railway Company, shall proceed immediately to take such steps as are required by law (if any are needed) to close all that portion of the road called Cathedral street, which lies north of the north side of Oliver street, and extending to North Avenue.

When to deliver.

Sec. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the said Northern Central Railway Company shall not be compelled to deliver possession of the said Bolton Depot grounds until the expiration of four months from the time it shall be entitled to obtain possession of all the ground described in the first section of this act, nor until four months from the time it shall be authorized by law to take possession of the ground now covered by what is
