

**Chapter 329.**

AN ACT to enable the qualified voters of Dublin district, number four, in Somerset county, to determine by ballot whether intoxicating liquors shall be sold in said district, or license granted for the sale of the same.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the question whether or not any person or persons, at any house as hereinafter described, may be licensed in Dublin district, in Somerset county, of this State, by whom or in which spirituous or fermented liquors may be sold, or whether or not no license to sell the same in said Dublin district, in said county, shall be issued, shall be submitted to the legally qualified voters in said Dublin district at the election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November next, for the election of a Representative in the next Congress of the United States, which election shall be held in accordance with the law governing such elections in this State; and the sheriff of Somerset county shall give notice of the time and purpose and place of said election by handbills posted in at least ten public places in said district, and one at the court-house door in Princess Anne, at least ten days before said election, in which notices a copy of this act shall be inserted, and two of said notices shall be securely posted in or on the house where said election takes place, on the day of said election, so that all persons can conveniently read the same; and the expenses of said election, including the costs of printing the handbills aforesaid, shall be levied by the commissioners of said county, and paid as other county expenses are paid; and at the election aforesaid the judges of election shall provide and have on the day of said election a separate ballot-box, similar to the one used at other elections in said district, in which only the ballots cast under the provisions of this act shall be deposited by said judges of election; and after closing of said polls the said ballots shall be counted and returned as in cases of election under the laws of this State.
