

nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent said druggist from keeping and using alcohol as a solvent for drugs, when such solutions are not to be used as a beverage.

Penalty for violation.

SUB-SECTION 6-6. Any person who shall sell or barter any intoxicating or spirituous or fermented liquors without first having obtained a license as required by this act shall, upon indictment and conviction therefor by the Circuit Court for Somerset county, be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than three hundred dollars, and be sentenced by said court to the county jail for not less than three months nor more than six months; and it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace, upon information received and confirmed by the oath of a creditable witness, to have any person so offending arrested and committed to the county jail, unless he shall give sufficient bail or recognizance, with sureties, to appear before the Circuit Court at the next succeeding term thereof to answer the charge.

How construed.

SUB-SECTION 7-7. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize any sale or barter or giving away of any spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer on the Sabbath day, commonly called Sunday, or on the day of any election held in said county under the constitution and laws of this State or of the United States.

Necessary to state.

SUB-SECTION 8-8. In any criminal prosecution under this act, it shall only be necessary to state that the traverser did sell, barter or give away spirituous liquor or fermented liquor, without specifying the particular kind of liquor so sold, bartered or given away.

Laws repealed

SUB-SECTION 9-9. *And be it enacted,* That all laws, or parts of laws, whether general or local laws, inconsistent with any of the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed so far as said Dublin district aforesaid in Somerset county is concerned.
