Saturday next preceding such holiday, and such Mondays so observed shall for all purposes whatever, as regards the presenting for payment or acceptance, and of the protesting and giving notice of the dishonor of bills of exchange, bank checks, drafts and promissory notes, be also treated and considered as is the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday.

Inconsistent laws repealed.

Sec. 3. Be it enacted, That all acts or parts of acts, and especially such sections of the Code of Public General Laws or of the Revised Code, with the supplements thereto, title "Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes," as are inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Effective.

SEC. 4. Be it enacted, That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chapter 24.

AN ACT authorizing Jerome B. Hall, guardian of John S. Melvin, a minor, to pass his final account with the Orphans' Court of Worcester county.

Pass final account as guar-

dian.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Jerome B. Hall, guardian of John S. Melvin, a minor, be and he is hereby authorized to pass his final account as guardian before the Orphans' Court of Worcester county, and to pay and deliver over to the said John S. Melvin. all his property, real and personal, and moneys that may be due to him on the said final account, and to take his receipt for the same, which shall be acknowledged and recorded in the office of the Register of Wills for said county, and have the same effect as if the same was executed by a person of full age.

Answerable for all debts.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, the said John S. Melvin shall be answerable for all debts, contracts and liabilities made and entered into by him, and may sue and be sued as fully as if he was of full age.
