If any person shall wilfully break or throw down any gate on said road, or dig up or spoil any part of said road, or obstruct any culvert, water way or side ditch, or forcibly or fraudulently pass any gate thereon, after payment of toll has been demanded of him or her, without having paid said toll, or shall ride or drive up to any one of the gates on said road with any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, so as to obstruct said road or gate, and the travel on or through the same, and neglect or refuse to pay his or her toll at such gate, he or she shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Montgomery county, shall be fined the sum of ten dollars, and shall be committed by said justice of the peace to the county jail of said county until said fine and costs are paid; provided, always, that any person convicted by a justice of the peace, under the provisions of this section, shall have the right to appeal from the judgment of said justice to the Circuit Court for Montgomery county.

Chapter 379.

AN ACT to add certain new sections to the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Garrett county," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as the same was enacted by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter one hundred and eight, to be designated as sections forty-six A, forty-six B and forty-six C.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the following new sections, to be known as sections forty-six A, forty-six B and forty-six C, be added to the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Garrett county," sub-title "Justices
