

Chapter 408.

AN ACT to repeal chapter three hundred and fifty-three of the acts passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, entitled "An act to incorporate the President and Commissioners of the town of Cecilton," and to enact the following in lieu thereof:

Repealed and
enacted in lieu

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That chapter three hundred and fifty-three of the acts passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, entitled "An act to incorporate the President and Commissioners of the town of Cecilton," be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following is hereby enacted in lieu thereof:

Corporation.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the inhabitants of the town of Cecilton, Cecil county, are a corporation by the name of President and Commissioners of the town of Cecilton, and by that name shall have perpetual succession; may sue and be sued; may purchase, hold and dispose of real, personal and mixed property for the use and benefit of said town, and may have and use a common seal, which may be altered at pleasure.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That they shall be five in number, and shall be elected on the first Monday in May annually; all male inhabitants of said town, citizens of the United States, above twenty-one years of age, who shall have *bona fide* resided in said town one year next preceding the election at which they shall offer to vote, shall be entitled to vote for commissioners of said town.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall annually designate the time and place of holding said election, and give at least two weeks notice thereof by notices set up at five of the most prominent places in said town, and at some meeting prior to the first Monday of May in each year, shall appoint some person to act as judge of said election, who, before acting as such, shall qualify in same manner as judges of election for State and county officers in this State are required to qualify
