

acter to said persons shall be erected or placed upon said lot in the event the present buildings should be torn down, but in case any objectionable thing is placed or attempted to be erected or placed thereon in the old buildings or otherwise, complaint may be made to the Commissioners of Easton, who shall have full power and whose duty it shall be to prevent the erection of said objectionable thing, or cause its removal after giving ten days' notice.

Chapter 413.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and thirteen of article eight of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Cecil County," sub-title, "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as amended and re-enacted by chapter three hundred and thirty-five, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, and to re-enact same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section one hundred and thirteen of article eight of the Code of Public Local laws, title "Cecil County," sub-title, "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as amended and re-enacted by chapter three hundred and thirty-five, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, be and the same is hereby repealed and amended, and re-enacted as amended, so as to read as follows:

SECTION 113. There shall be the following number of justices of the peace and constables for Cecil county: For each of the election districts, number three, five, six and seven, three justices of the peace and two constables; for the remaining districts, two justices of the peace and two constables for each district.
