

Chapter 35.

AN ACT to Protect the Health of Female Employees of Baltimore city.

Seats for female employees.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall be the duty of all employers of females in any mercantile or manufacturing business or occupation in the city of Baltimore, to provide and maintain suitable seats for the use of such female employees, and to permit the use of such seats by such employees to such an extent as may be reasonable for the preservation of their health.

Penalty for violation.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That any violation of this act by any employer shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and shall be punishable by a fine of one hundred and fifty dollars, to be collected as other fines are collected.

Chapter 36.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay John W. Bell, late Collector of State Taxes in Montgomery county, the amount overpaid by him into the Treasury.

Issue warrant.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of this State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of this State to pay John W. Bell, of Montgomery county, the sum of twenty-one dollars and twenty-one cents, being the amount overpaid by the said John W. Bell into the Treasury as collector of State taxes for the fifth collection district of Montgomery county, as certified by the officers of the Treasury Department, as required by section thirty-three of article three of the constitution.

Effective.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
