Chapter 37.

AN ACT to repeal chapter two hundred and sixteen of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An Act to Remove all Gates from the Main Public Roads of Anne Arundel county," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That chapter two hundred and sixteen of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An Act to Remove all Gates from the Main Public Roads of Anne Arundel county," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That from and after the first day of January, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, it shall not be lawful for any person, with or without the consent of the County Commissioners, to erect, have or keep any gate upon the main public roads of Anne Arundel county, and the road supervisors of said county shall cause all gates to be removed therefrom in their respective districts from and after the date in this section hereinbefore named.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That any person who shall, in any way or manner, hinder, obstruct, molest or disturb any supervisor in the performance of the duties required of him under the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be liable to presentment and indictment by the grand jury of Anne Arundel county, and shall on conviction thereof by a court of law, be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, and be imprisoned in the county jail for not less than thirty days nor more than ninety days, or both in the discretion of the court before which he shall be tried and convicted, the said fine to be applied to the road fund of the county.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That any supervisor who shall fail or neglect to perform his duties under
