

and sale under such writ; and of each of the other judgments there shall be embraced in said record only a short copy, and only the docket entries of the writs of execution thereon respectively; and no clerk shall record any decree or judgment except such as relates to the title to land, or those under which lands have been sold in virtue of an execution thereon.

What to record.

SECTION 19. If any clerk shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of the three preceding sections, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall forfeit the sum of two hundred dollars for the use of the State.

Chapter 470.

AN ACT to appropriate the sum of seven hundred and thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents to pay the claim of W. L. Pfeiffer, of Annapolis, Maryland, against the State.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay W. L. Pfeiffer, of Annapolis, Maryland, the sum of seven hundred and thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents, due him for renovating house and committee rooms, &c., as per bill rendered; said bill having been examined by the Comptroller of the State and by him approved.

Issue warrant.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
