Chapter 477.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section thirty-two of article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," as repealed and re-enacted by the act of January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter two hundred and sixty-eight.

Repealed and re-enacted. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section thirty-two of article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," as repealed and re-enacted by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, chapter two hundred and sixty-eight, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Devolve upon husband. SEC. 32. If the intestate be a married woman, and shall leave no child or children or descendants, all her personal property, including therein all choses in action, shall devolve upon her husband absolutely; and it shall not in such case be necessary for him to administer upon her estate, in order to pass title to him, unless she shall be liable in law for debts owing by her; but if the intestate be a married woman, and leaves a child or children or descendants, her personal estate, including all choses in action, shall devolve upon her administrator or administrators, and the surplus of her estate shall be distributed by the Orphans' Court to the husband for his life, and no longer, and

Devolve upon administrator.
