after his death, then to her children and descendants, per stirpes; and it shall be the duty of the Orphans' Court granting the said administration, to direct the mode in which the said estate shall be invested so as best to secure the rights of children or others interested, after the expiration of the life estate; and the whole of the said personal estate shall be subject to the orders of the Orphans' Court, and shall not be disposed of by the administrator except by virtue of an order or a decree duly passed by said court.

Chapter 478.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money for the benefit of the "Industrial Home for Colored Girls" of Baltimore city.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State to pay the Board of Managers of the Industrial Home for Colored Girls of Baltimore city, the sum of five thousand dollars, in semiannual instalments of twenty-five hundred dollars each, on the first day of June and the first day of December next ensuing.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take Effective. effect from the date of its passage.
