

taxes shall be collected by the treasurer of said corporation, who shall have power to collect or distrain for the same as any collector of State or county taxes in Maryland has to collect or distrain for State or county taxes.

Taxes—how collected.

SECTION 16. *And be it enacted*, That in each and every year, at the first meeting of the commissioners after they have qualified, as provided in section fourteen of this act, they shall appoint some person who is a resident of said town, and a legal voter of Maryland, as treasurer of said corporation, who shall be the receiver, custodian and disbursing officer of all moneys, funds and securities of said corporation, under the order and control of said corporation; he shall hold his office for one year from the date of his appointment, or until his successor is duly qualified; the treasurer so appointed, before entering upon his duties, shall give bond to the said commissioners in such penalty as they may prescribe, with sureties to be by them approved; and the condition of said bond shall be that he, the said treasurer, will well and faithfully account for all moneys and securities received by him for the use or benefit of said corporation, and that he will well and truly pay to or on the order of said commissioners all money received by him as treasurer of said corporation; and will, on demand of said commissioners, deliver to them any and all securities or property of said corporation in his keeping, and that he will not pay out or expend any money or property of said corporation except on a written order of said commissioners duly authenticated; and the said bond shall be recorded by the clerk among the records of said corporation; and the commissioners shall, in their discretion, fix the salary or compensation that the treasurer shall receive.
