Crisp, deceased, admitted to probate in the Orphans' Court of Anne Arundel county on the twenty-third day of February, A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-one; and the said Annie E. Crisp and Frederick G. Crisp, trustees as aforesaid, and the Central Presbyterian church, are hereby authorized and empowered to apply to the General Assembly of Maryland for the passage of such future acts of assembly as may be necessary to carry out the aforesaid provision of said will.

Apply for future acts of assembly.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

### Chapter 45.

AN ACT giving the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to a certain legacy bequeathed by the last will and testament of Thomas Butler, late of Frederick county, deceased, to Saint John's Catholic Church, in Frederick City, Maryland.

WHEREAS Thomas Butler, late of Frederick county, deceased, did, by his last will and testament, bearing date on the fourth day of August, eighteen hundred and eighty-one, and duly admitted to probate in the Orphans' Court of Frederick county on the eleventh day of January, eighteen hundred and eighty-two, bequeath unto Saint John's Catholic Church, in Frederick City, Maryland, the sum of two hundred dollars, therefore,
