Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to subscribe in the name of the State to two hundred and fifty copies of J. T. Ringgold's "Index to the Maryland Reports" and digests comprising the four existing digests and the reports to the year 1881 inclusive; provided, that the price thereof shall not exceed ten dollars per copy; and provided further, that any three judges of the Court of Appeals of the State shall certify under their hands and seals, that in their opinion, the said "Index" deserves the patronage of the State, and the librarian is further authorized and directed to distribute the same number of copies of said "Index" and in the same way as the copies of the "Maryland Reports" are now by law authorized to be distributed, and the residue to sell or exchange for such other books as may be required by the State Librarian; provided nevertheless, that the said librarian shall retain thirty-five copies in said library for the use thereof.

Joint resolution extending the term of service of Hon. James L. Bartol as Judge of the Court of Appeals.
