tificate under his hand setting forth the actual gross weight of any number of cattle or hogs or any other live stock so weighed by him to their owner or his agent, making such allowances in the nature of tare on account of any dirt, mud, filth or any other matter adhering to the same he may think just or proper; but no live stock shall be weighed, sold or purchased, contracted for or offered for sale on Sunday; any one weighing, selling or purchasing, or contracting or offering to buy, sell or weigh any live stock on Sunday shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five dollars for each one sold or weighed, or purchased or offered for sale on said day, to be recovered by a suit before a justice of the peace for the city or county where such sale, weighing or purchasing shall be made, one-half to the informer, the other half to be paid to the State Treasurer, and Thursday shall hereafter be the regular sale day at said scales.

Chapter 54.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of James E. Tate, W. L. Pfeiffer and Edgar Hutton.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer, to pay to James E. Tate, for sundries furnished House of Delegates and Senate, as per order of chief clerk, four hundred and sixty dollars; to W. L. Pfeiffer, for furniture furnished by order of chief clerk, one hundred and twelve dollars; and to Edgar Hutton, for repairs done and material furnished by order of the Governor and chief clerk, eighty-one dollars and forty cents.

Sec. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
