Submitted to legal voters.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall be, at the next municipal election to be held in said city of Hagerstown, submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection; and at the said election the vote on said proposed act shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be written or printed the words, "For the act to encourage manufactures," or "Against the act to encourage manufactures," as the voter shall elect, and immediately after said election due return shall be made to the mayor of said city, who shall prepare a certificate proclaiming the result of such election, and cause said certificate to be published once in each newspaper published in said city; and if it shall appear by the said return that a majority of the votes have been cast "For the act to encourage manufactures," then this act shall take effect from and after the date of said proclamation by the mayor; but if it shall appear that a majority of the votes have been cast "Against the act to encourage manufactures," then this act shall be null and of no effect.

Proclaim the result.

Effective.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
