Chapter 59.

AN ACT to pay Jacob Watts a sum of money erroneously paid by him into the Treasury.

Issue warrant.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay to Jacob Watts the sum of twenty-eight dollars and five cents, the same having been erroneously paid by him into the treasury, and its repayment being recommended by the Comptroller and the Treasurer.

Chapter 60.

AN ACT granting the assent of the General Assembly of Maryland to a bequest made to the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church at Middletown, Maryland, by Eli H. Hyatt, late of Frederick county, deceased.

Preamble.

Whereas Eli H. Hyatt, late of Frederick county, deceased, by his last will and testament, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, duly admitted to probate and recorded in the office of the Register of Wills of Frederick county, devised and bequeathed to the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church situated in Middletown, Maryland, and to their successors in office for certain uses therein named, the sum of five hundred dollars; now wherefore—

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given, granted and declared to the above mentioned devise and bequest of the said Eli H. Hyatt, deceased.
