CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT entitled, an Act to incorporate the Plum Point Wharf Company, of Calvert county. Passed Feb. 7, 1866.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Mason L. Weems, of Baltimore city, John H. Basford, Samuel B. Wilson, Richard Hance, James S. Morsell, Jun'r., Doct. William McDaniel, William P. Dorsey and James I. Briscoe, of Calvert county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, with power to supply any vacancy that may occur in their body by death, resignation or otherwise; that is to say, that they or a majority of them, after giving at least fifteen days notice by publication in such newspapers and by such other mode as they in their discretion shall deem most conducive to the interest of their enterprise, shall open a book or books at such place or places as they may designate, for receiving subscriptions to the capital stock to erect a wharf or pier in the Chesapeake Bay, at or near Plum Point, in Calvert county, and thereupon, they or a majority of their board, shall proceed to receive subscriptions to the capital stock of the company, by this act incorporated, the said stock to be limited to fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of fifty dollars each, and the said books shall be kept open as long as the said commissioners or a majority of them shall deem prudent.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That as soon as one hundred shares of the capital stock of the company created by their act, shall have been subscribed, the said commissioners or a majority of them shall call a meeting of the subscribers to the said capital
