

license to any person to sell spirituous or fermented liquors of any kind at any place within three miles of either of the churches in the village of Wolfsville, Frederick county, Maryland, and that any person selling any spirituous or fermented liquors or any other kind of intoxicating drinks, whether of original manufacture or of a mixed character, within the above described limits, shall, on conviction, be subject to the same fines and punishments now prescribed by the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland for selling spirituous or fermented liquors without license.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 105.

AN ACT to repeal section thirty-eight, of article twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, of the State of Maryland, and re-enact the same with amendments. Passed Feb. 8, 1866.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section thirty-eight, of article twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, "Private Roads," be repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows: Repealed.

Sub-Section 33. Any owner or owners of a mill, factory, distillery, quarry or lime kiln, situated within one mile of any railroad, may apply to the county commissioners of the county to lay out and open a private road from each mill, factory, distillery, quarry or lime kiln, to the most convenient place for intersecting such railroad, and on such application the county commissioners, shall proceed in the same manner and with the same powers as if such application were for a private road to a farm. May apply for opening road.
