license to any person to sell spirituous or fermented liquors of any kind at any place within three mil of either of the churches in the village of Wolfsville, Frederick county, Maryland, and that any person selling any spirituous or fermented liquors or any other kind of intoxicating drinks, whether of original manufacture or of a mixed character, within the above described limits, shall, on conviction, be subject to the same fines and punishments now prescribed by the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland for selling spirituous or fermented liquors without license.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall In force. take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 105.

AN ACT to repeal section thirty-eight, of article Passed Feb. twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, of the State of Maryland, and re-enact the same with amendments

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Repealed. of Maryland, That section thirty-eight, of article twenty-eight, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, "Private Roads," be repealed and reenacted so as to read as follows:

Sub-Section 38. Any owner or owners of a mill, May apply factory, distillery, quarry or lime kiln, situated for or road. within one mile of any railroad, may apply to the county commissioners of the county to lay out and open a private road from each mill, factory, distillery, quarry or lime kilns, to the most convenient place for intersecting such railroad, and on such application the county commissioners, shall proceed in the same manner and with the same powers as if such application were for a private road to a farm.
