## CHAPTER 116.

AN ACT to incorporate the Colored Laboring Sons 8, 1866. and Daughters Beneficial Society of Hagerstown.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly Incorporated. of Maryland, That Henry Darks, Charles Reeder, Jacob F. Wheeton, Jeremiah Farmer, Lloyd Morgan, Samuel Lake, Cornelius Green and [and] the officers and members of the Colored Laboring Sons and Daughters Beneficial Society of Hagerstown, they and their successors, be and they are hereby, declared a body politic for the objects and intentions of said society, which are hereby declared to be for mutual aid and assistance and benevolent purposes generally.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That said society shall make consti-have power to make a constitution and by-laws to tution, carry out their purposes, and the same to alter, amend or abolish at pleasure; provided, they shall Provisos. in no wise conflict with the Constitution and Laws of the State of Maryland, or of the United States of America, in which they may require such dues and fines as may be necessary; they may also receive donations, invest their funds in stocks, personal or real estate, or in such manner as they, or a majority of them, may deem best; provîded, they shall at no time have, hold or possess property, exceeding in value the sum of ten thousand dollars.

- Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That they and their May sue and successors may sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in accordance with the laws of this State, to have and use a common seal, and the same to alter and break at their pleasure; but Banking pronothing in this act shall be construed to authorise hibited. the issuing of any note, token, device, or evidence of debt, to be used as currency; and the General Assembly hereby reserves the right to alter, amend Reservation. or abolish this act of incorporation at pleasure.
- Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall In force. take effect from and after its passage.
