

them by this Act, each member of the body so failing shall be liable to indictment for such default, and shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, but any member may protect himself from prosecution as aforesaid by giving immediate information of such default to the Comptroller, who shall take such steps in regard to the matter as the case may require.

Sec. 31. *And be it enacted*, That each Assessor shall receive four dollars a day for every day he shall be actually engaged in the performance of his duties, to be paid by the respective counties and the city of Baltimore, and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall also allow to each of the members of the Board of Control and Review, for the services to be performed by them under this Act, such compensation as they may deem just, which shall be paid by the said city. Sec. 32. *And be it enacted*, That all fines and forfeitures imposed by this Act shall be recoverable by indictment in the Circuit Court of the proper county in which the person so offending may reside, or in the Criminal Court in Baltimore, if the person resides in that city, and one-half thereof shall be paid to the informer and the other half to the Treasurer for the use of the State. Sec. 33. *And be it enacted*, That so much of the several Acts heretofore passed in relation to the valuation and assessment of property in this State as may come in conflict with the provisions of this Act, and all laws exempting property from valuation, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and all existing laws of this State, that may come in aid of the provisions of this Act, shall apply and be construed as part thereof. Laws repeal-  
ed.

Sec. 34. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.
