

with, or doing business in competition with the line over which the dispatch is required to be sent.

Sec. 9. *Be it further enacted*, That the said company shall transmit all dispatches in the order in which they are received, under a penalty of one hundred dollars, to be recovered, with costs of suit, by the person whose dispatch is postponed out of its order; *provided, however*, that arrangements may be made with the proprietors or publishers of newspapers for the transmission, for publication, of intelligence of general and public interest out of its order.

CHAPTER 35.

AN ACT to repeal sections one hundred and ninety-four, one hundred and ninety-six, and one hundred and ninety-seven, of article four, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Docks, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Passed Feb. 8, 1866.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections one hundred and ninety-four, one hundred and ninety-six, and one hundred and ninety-seven, of article four, of the Code of Public Local Laws of this State, be and the same are hereby repealed, and re-enacted to read as follows :
