

ations as they may deem just and proper, the square or lot of ground, with the Mansion and Appurtenances, lying between the Harbor, Hanover street, Governor's street and Scott street, in the city of Annapolis, which since the establishment of the Government has been and now is the official residence of the Governor of this State.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the Governor, Comptroller and Treasurer shall with the proceeds of the property authorised herein to be sold, and such other money as may be appropriated by law for that purpose, procure, by purchase or otherwise, in the name of the State of Maryland, a lot or parcel of ground in Annapolis, as a site for the future residence of the Governor of Maryland, and by erecting buildings and improvements thereon, provide a suitable Mansion and Appurtenances for that purpose. Authorized to purchase site.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force,

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT to repeal sections seventy-two, seventy-three, seventy-four, seventy-five, seventy-six, seventy-seven, seventy-eight, seventy-nine, eighty, eighty-one, eighty-two, eighty-three, eighty-four and eighty-seven, of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws of volume two, title "Alleghany county," and re-enact the same with amendments. Passed Feb. 7, 1866.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections seventy-two, seventy-three, seventy-four, seventy-five, seventy-six, seventy-seven, seventy-eight, seventy-nine, eighty, eighty-one, eighty-two, eighty-three, eighty-four Sections repealed.
