43. To the gift, grant, devise and bequest by Martin A. Castle of Frederick County, Maryland, unto the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church and to the Home Missionary Board of the Methodist Episcopal Church, legacies each amounting to Seventeen hundred ninety-eight dollars and ninety-eight cents (\$1,798.98), said gift taking effect on July 23rd, 1925.

44. To the gift, grant, devise and bequest of W. Webster Kinder of Federalsburg, Caroline County, Maryland, unto the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church as the residuary legatee under his Last Will and Testament the sum of Eighteen thousand nine hundred two dollars and thirty-one cents (\$18,902.31), which sum was received July 22nd, 1929.

45. To the gift, grant, devise and bequest by Rachel E. Linthicum of Libertytown, Frederick County, Maryland, unto the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the legacy of Fifty dollars (\$50.00), said gift being received April 21st, 1924.

46. To the gift, grant, devise and bequest of John L. Walsh of Baltimore County, Maryland, unto the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the sum of One hundred dollars (\$100.00) in cash, said legacy being received May 5th, 1922.

Taylor of Berlin, Worcester County, Maryland, unto the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension, the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), which legacy was paid December 12, 1927.
