

1 each county. We felt that the judge who may have three
2 or four counties under his control would be familiar
3 enough with the people to appoint the Commissioners.
4 That is why we put it in the Circuit Court.

5 JUDGE FAIRBANKS: There will certainly have
6 to be a Committee magistrate in every county, more than
7 one probably.

8 JUDGE CARTER: Who appoints the assistants,
9 the chief trial judge or chief justice?

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Chief justice.

11 JUDGE PRENDERCAST: May I suggest bail set
12 by Commissioners who are not lawyers, the confusion in
13 the Criminal Court would be behind description.

14 JUDGE RASIN: That is the reason I asked the
15 question, who is going to hold preliminary hearings under
16 this setup.

17 MRS. BOTHE: Baltimore City wouldn't have
18 Commissioners. At least, there wouldn't be any idea of
19 it. It would be just in the sparsely populated areas
20 where there are no People's Court judges.
