

1 MR. MARTINEAU: Whatever administrative dis-
2 tricts may be established for the Circuit Court, they
3 will be, or that will be done by rule of the court and
4 will merely be for administrative purposes.

5 MR. INVERNIZZI: There would be a judge in the
6 Circuit Court for the State of Maryland.

7 JUDGE TUCKER: Mr. Chairman, I think the long
8 term is much better for the reasons stated by my other
9 senile colleagues.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Judge.

11 JUDGE TUCKER: Senile, question marks.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Judge Rasin, we will certainly
13 consider your suggestion. Right at the moment, I can't
14 think of the words that we can use to do it, but we will
