Commission in connection with unicameralism vs. bicameralism that it would be a good idea to have alternative possibilities which we would submit to the convention in our working papers and perhaps in the proposal itself.

Not only with the nature of the presentation, but what shall be our views concerning what we do with it.

Dr. John H. Michener has already turned over to us a statement on the structure of the Maryland Legislature and we may want to go along through this and say to him take as much time as he feels that he would need to make this paper clear.

DR. MICHENER: We will start out with the statement that there are a number of claims and arguments in this paper pro and con, and these are largely based on assertions which are not documented by objective facts where they are attested to by documents. They basically rest on value judgment you have to either accept or reject, such as, is there a higher quality legislature that comes from a unicameralist system. That claim is made, for example, in Nebraska. This gets back to basically value

judgment, of what is a higher quality of legislature.
