seems to me to be a pure straw man --DR. MICHENER: Straw man, in the sense that it 2 is no longer valid. 3 MR. SCANLAN: It hasn't been valid for 150 years. 5 DR. MICHENER: But it is not a straw man. 6 reason I mentioned it is that historically this is the 7 argument that led to the strong arguments for bicameralism. 8 MR. SCANLAN: It would not be an argument for 9 bicameralism today. 10 DR. MICHENER: What happened was the original 11 arguments died and other arguments were substituted for 12 them. 13 MR. SCANLAN: I want to make clear this is not 14 an argument today that would justify it. 15 DR. MICHENER: I say the argument is no longer 16 made today. As a matter of fact, the other argument which 17 has been made up until very recently is that the two houses 18 permit representation of two different interests or inter-19 ests in two different chambers and, of course, historically, 20 this is the one that has been the strong argument in the 21

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
