MR. CASE: He had quite a bit to say. 1 DR. SENSENBAUGH: But he gave a proposal 2 after the word revision, in one of the suggestions, 3 provided, however, that, and he goes on and spells out what it is, but I don't think that should be 5 spelled out in the Constitution. 6 MR. CASE: I am speaking only as the Chair-7 man, now, but I quite agree with you. I got lost after 8 the first couple of lines of Mr. Raver's statement, 9 but what I am wondering is --10 DR. JENKINS: Subsequently, Mr. Raver agreed 11 that that would not be too helpful. I think he blamed 12 that on his attorney rather than himself. 13 MR. CASE: It is always easy to fall back on 14 that excuse, Dr. Jenkins.
