MR. ENEY: What he is thinking of is the 1 recommendation of the executive department, not the 2 recommendation, but the matters being considered by 3 the executive department as to the complete power of 4 the Governor over appointive officers. 5 MR. BROOKS: Not just that, but over-all 6 aspects of the power of the executive branch over 7 appointed administrators. 8 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Yes, I would oppose the 9 chief executive having authority in appointing a State 10 Superintendent, if this is the type of thing you're 11. referring to, which is one element, I guess, of what 12 you are speaking of. 13 MR. CASE: You've got plenty of support for 14 that on the Commission. 15 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Well, it is contrary to 16 what is happening across the country. The movement 17 is towards the type of system Maryland has, where you 18 have Boards of Education and Boards of Education have 19 independence in selecting their superintendent and not 20 MR. CASE: We will have the Governor 21
