1 MR. CASE: I am going to call on the State Superintendent to in turn call on such people as he 2 would like to have speak. 3 4 DR. JENKINS: Your knowledge officially extends only back a couple of years? 5 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Just a few years. 6 7 course, you heard Dr. Earhart. I think it would be sad if we brought Mr. Sartorius and he didn't get his 8 9 name in the record. Mr. Sartorius may want to speak 10 to you as to his experience with relation to the 11 Budget Bureau during the time he was in the State 12 Department. 13 MR. WILLIAM S. SARTORIUS: I might say I was in the State Department working on budgets and 14 estimates and questions and so forth from 1952 to 15 16 1961, a nine-year period. During that time, I worked with four different budget analysts, Dick Andrews, 17 18 Henry Boss and Homer Coppen, and there was another one 19 in there who went to Boston. I forgot his name, right 20 In other words, what I'm trying to say, there was

a turnover and we had to sit down very patiently and
