place where this should be worked out, rather than
through some other agency of county government going
into the county school boards' offices and that sort
of thing and trying to get backup information on the
various elements that go into financial State aid.

Now, I might say we had good relations. In

the nine years that I had anything to do with the budget at all, we never had any disagreement. We never had any -- sure, some of our budgets were adjusted from time to time. Based on our study, we called the budget people in and we said we have a different estimate. Sometimes they have estimated up and sometimes down and it was down sometimes right up until the time of the legislature. We often made, in a supplemental budget, we'd get the State Board to approve a revision of the estimates for State aid and submit them, and there wasn't any problem.

Looking at it from the other angle, as a county superintendent, we would certainly want to see the State Department of Education with all its resources and its contacts and its work with the local
