

1 MR. CASE: It just never leaves the treasury.

2 DR. SENSENBAUGH: That's right. They make  
3 payments during the year and the final payment has to  
4 be the accurate payment.

5 MR. HOFF: How many times a year are funds  
6 turned over to the State Department?

7 DR. EARHART: Six times. The money isn't  
8 turned over. We simply prepare letters of transmittal  
9 to the Comptroller's office and the Comptroller's office  
10 makes the payments.

11 MR. CASE: Directly to the counties?

12 DR. EARHART: That's right. It goes to the  
13 School Board, not to the county government, but to the  
14 School Board.
