MR. BROOKS: I would like to return to the 1 question and put it in a little different context by 2 giving this thought background, that actually the 3 structure of government in a modern society is more regulated, the heart of it is more likely found in the 5 budgetary process than elsewhere in the Constitution, 6 and a few comments were made concerning the fact the 7 Federal Government is taking more interest in educa-8 tion. 9

Under the Federal system, however, it is interesting to note that education is altogether part of the executive function and is regulated by the Executive Department of the government. Under the present Maryland Constitution, the significant aspects of the budgetary provisions would indicate that education is somewhat separated from the control of the executive branch which would really raise the question as to whether or not it should be recommended that education be established as a fourth branch of government, and that is really the crucial issue, probably,

at the heart of the matter, whether or not education
