covering the School Board and the Superintendent of 1 Schools, and we at least tentatively rejected the suggestion on the Miscellaneous Provisions Committee on 3 the basis that things have been going so very well and, as you say, have been over such a substantial period 5 and it was unnecessary and perhaps even dangerous to change the course of events by changing or adding to 7 the Constitution on the subject, and I wonder what 8 your thoughts are on that? 9 I noticed that -- this is DR. SENSENBAUGH: 10 true, this was discussed and one who was entered in 11 your recommendations was the University of Maryland. 12 I wondered, though, why, being a member of the Board 13 of Trustees of the State colleges, which is going to 14 be quite a sizable group, why this was not entered, 15 although you did indicate that there were so many 16 different colleges; but these colleges did not have 17 separate boards. Maybe it would be wrong to spell out 18 in the Constitution that there would be a single board 19 continually operating the State colleges in Maryland, 20 because it might possibly be some day you may want to 21
