system with their staff. Now, I don't know whether this is leading 2 toward anything you had in mind or what? 3 MR. BROOKS: Yes. I think it is practicable to discuss whether or not society has developed in the 5 6 last hundred years to the point where it might in fact be desirable, because of the significance of education, 7 8 to recognize it as a full fourth department of the government and not have the aspects of what in reality 9 10 it might be in recognition of this in various other 11 articles, without ever really recognizing that that 12 is what has in fact been accomplished through other provisions, and maybe education is that significant 13 and all of education should be combined in a separate 14 15 department. If we have so advanced, then I think it 16 might be worthwhile to have the views of yourself and 17 others on whether or not the time is ripe for the con-18
