about? 1 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Yes, there would be a 2 great deal of it. I think the quality of the Governor 3 would very definitely influence the kind of an educational system you would have. I could think of 5 governors that would be very concerned about education and --MR. ENEY: What specifically do you think 8 the Governor would seek to do or to prevent the Super-9 intendent from doing, if the Superintendent served 10 under his direction? 11 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Well, I haven't been in 12 such a situation and my impression would be that you 13 could get to the point of being influenced in the 14 appointments of personnel. 15 Teachers? MR. ENEY: 16 DR. SENSENBAUGH: 17 MR. BROOKS: Principals of schools? 18 DR. SENSENBAUGH: Principals of schools. 19 MRS. FREEDLANDER: Except that the State 20 Department hasn't anything to do with that.
