DR. SENSENBAUGH: There was at one point, several years ago. I'm not clear on the details. I think there was some legislation to change the appointment of the Superintendent of Schools, the State Superintendent. It didn't get very far, but it was -- I remember, I was Superintendent, I think it was in Frederick County. It must be in the past ten years. There was this type of legislation introduced, but it never cleared the committees. What the purpose of it was, I don't know. Of course, there are all kinds of
