on it and this is just what has happened. 1 MR. ENEY: May I go back to Mrs. Bothe's 2 question and maybe ask Dr. Earhart to answer the ques-3 This goes back a little bit in the background 4 that we have been dealing with. Talking still about 5 this provision in subparagraph 11, Section 52, that 6 the estimates for the public schools as provided by 7 law shall be transmitted to the Governor and not be 8 changed; isn't the net effect of this provision merely 9 to leave it to the legislature rather than to the 10 Governor, the determination of what moneys shall be 11 appropriated for schools initially? 12 DR. EARHART: Well, the budget that we 13 present to the Budget Bureau which, in effect, becomes 14 the Governor's budget is presented to the legislature 15 and then, of course, is subject to the action --16 MR. ENEY: That is not my question. With 17 18

respect to the other departments, the Governor exercises his judgment, not thinking of the legislative or the judiciary, and he initiates the budget and says that this department or that department shall have this
