because I am involved in this, every now and then there 1 are joint hearings and this is one way by which a bicameral 2 body can break through the unattractiveness of bringing administrative heads down on two or three occasions in order to appear for hearings, and this has been happening. It is kind of interesting as to how the structure of bicameralism tries to adapt itself in order to avoid committee overhauling. ឧ DR. MICHENER: To anticipate something further 9 on, in connection with joint committees, I didn't mention 10 the fact of duplicating appearances on the administrative 11 people which is a serious problem on the Federal level 12 because, from what little I know about Maryland here, I 13 didn't find that to be a problem. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, it is. 15 Is it?
