for the need of an educational article in the Consti-1 tution at all. 2 MRS. BOTHE: There has been sentiment ex-3 pressed going the other way, to take out the special privileges accorded the education department and take 5 out the education article. 6 MR. BROOKS: And when you are talking about 7 the fundamental law of the State, you are interested 8 in the basic structure and the question is, is education a part of that basic structure as against the other 10 11 departments under the major division of the State 12 government or is it not, and at the moment we have still left it, so to speak, in this hybrid position, 13 that it is a little more important than anything else, 14 but not up to the level of a provision of the State 15 government. 16 MR. HOFF: If you make it a separate part 17 of our State government, it would mean the election 18 of school officials. 19 20 MRS. BOTHE: No. 21 MR. BROOKS: Not necessarily.
