MR. PERKINS: I'm utterly opposed to anybody having autonomy. I think the Governor or President or any chief executive should be the responsible person and, in education, I've seen it in other places where they have had their way and the rest of the county government has had to compete with education all the time because education has been the favorite of the community. They have gotten the biggest part of the tax dollar, and Roads and everything else had to suffer for it, and it is wrong. Nobody should have autonomy.

MRS. BOTHE: You simply don't believe

education is that important, as compared to other --

MR. PERKINS:

roads, so are all your other problems, water, sewer.

There are other problems that should have their rightful place in the budget.

It is important, but so are
