course, placed into the Constitution the prohibition which we have now. So that the word grant is in there for a purpose. It isn't just a word thrown in without any purpose or without any meaning. The Legislature could at that time have said there shall be no lotteries. There would be no need to put in grant unless they meant something by the word grant. The purpose was to prohibit a lottery grant, not a lottery. It is my contention and it is the contention of some others -- although it is contradicted by a great many others -- that this provision in the Constitution only prohibits the Legislature from making a lottery grant but it does not state that there shall be no lotteries in the State of Maryland.

I think this is important to keep in mind
