Then in another magazine, Sign Magazine, the National Catholic Magazine, there В was a statement made in an editorial in which it was 9 10 also said as follows: "Catholic theologians teach that 11 under certain conditions gambling is not immoral. As for a national lottery, they teach that it is not 12 immoral if honesty is observed in conducting it, if there 13 is a reasonable proportion between the amount contributed 14 and the prize and if there are effective restrictions 15 to prevent people from unduly squandering their money. 16 It is possible that the gambling urge of Americans would 17 be satisfied if the individual could go to a government-18 operated office and place a bet or to the post office 19 and buy a lottery ticket.
